- The purpose of Probus is to stimulate thought, interest and participation in activities at a time in life when it is easy to become complacent and self-centred.
- Probus Clubs are non-political; nonsectarian; non-profit making and nonfundraising.
- The first PROBUS Club, specifically for active retirees, was formed in 1966 by the Rotary Club of Caterham, England to allow retired professionals to continue to meet together for fellowship.
- On March 17, 1987 the first Probus Club in Canada was started in Cambridge.
- Our Probus Club of Bracebridge was the first in Muskoka. It started in 1996.
- As of March, 2015 there were 236 active Probus Clubs in Canada with 32,735 members.
- There are 7 PROBUS Clubs in Muskoka with about 1200 members.

At sixteen years of age Carol graduated grade 13 and began her working life and started her family. She also completed the 4 year Canadian Institute of Management and Administration program.

Carol began a career in Municipal Government and time flew. Thirty years later she retired to commence life's more important pursuits. During this period Carol received the Award of Valour, twice, for lifesaving.

Carol was a Brown Owl with the Girl Guides, a parental support committee member with the 68th Army Cadet Corp, taught first aid and coached soccer. She has also served on various volunteer and professional boards.

Scuba diving became a passion and this has been enjoyed in Georgian Bay, the Bahamas, the Florida Keys and the Caribbean.

Horses also became a passion and keeping her own horses and training new horses became a full time job. Carol competed quite successfully in Competitive and Endurance long distance riding in races up to 75 miles in length. A Silver Medal at the National Canadian Competitive Trail Riding Championship in 2002 was a highlight. During this time Carol met her husband and also Tina and Rae Fyfe who introduced Carol to Probus

After retiring from competitive riding and the last horse passed on the farm was sold and a move made to a townhouse on the Muskoka River in Bracebridge was made.

Carol has a blended family of 5 children and 8 grandchildren which are priority one. Other

priorities include sewing, painting, reading, cooking, skiing, hiking, boating and travel.

Carol recounted her recent boat journey on their 43 foot trawler that completed the "Great Circle Loop". Briefly, a start in Georgian Bay to Lake Michigan to the Mississippi River, south to the Gulf of Mexico across Florida waterways, up the eastern seaboard to the Hudson River to the St. Lawrence River and finally through the Rideau and Trent waterways home to Georgian Bay. A remarkable journey with more on the horizon.

Speaker - Chris Litschko - CEO Lakeland Holding Ltd. and Team

Mr. . Litschko and his team presented a topic dear to many of our hearts. The rollout of high speed fibre optic internet infrastructure and services in both rural and urban Muskoka.

Lakeland Holding Ltd. (LHL) which is owned by the six municipalities of Bracebridge, Huntsville, Parry Sound, Burk's Falls, Sundridge and Magnetawan decided several years ago to leverage some of their existing infrastructure to initiate a new program of installing fibre optic internet distribution services. A large part of the decision to proceed was the successful application for partial project funding from the Small Communities Fund Project overseen by Infrastructure Canada, a federal program.

A plan to install 215 kilometres between Bracebridge and Huntsville over five years has been embarked upon where the new service could be available to 3300 households. LHL has projected an 1200-2000 new customers in their business plan. They have managed a sales success rate of over 70% which far exceeds their projections. Hopefully this will encourage LHL to address more marginal rural addresses in their upgrade plans.

Those of us who are saddled with Xplornent (snail satellite) Vianet, and the expense of Bell are keen to see LHL blanket the entire region with their service. It will take time as the company has to apply on an annual basis for new SCF grants which support the expansion. Many of us will have to be patient.

Hopefully the new federal government will continue and even enhance the Canada Infrastructure fund which would hopefully allow LHL to see their grants increase and accelerate the building of their fibre optic network.

It does appear that no matter how well the business develops for LHL that many in the rural part of Muskoka will miss out. This is unfortunate, as has been observed by LHL having or not having advanced internet services does affect property values. This issue has not yet been addressed by MPAC in their current assessment process. Perhaps this point could be used as leverage with the municipal shareholders of LHL to have the network expanded beyond what is planned.

In any event we all wish LHL the best in their exciting endeavor.
